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following the publication of the department of health document comprehensive critical care 2000 the majority of hospitals in england have set up critical care outreach teams the government provided a significant sum of money for hospitals to set up outreach services there are now calls for an evaluation of their impact the book is set out in five key sections each section features chapters that address the conceptual and real life issues in each section there is a chapter set out as a case study example demonstrating how innovative practices and service developments are going on around critical care outreach the book will draw upon the knowledge experience and clinical expertise of senior critical care nurses and doctors from a critical care network the book will have a definite practical application and will provide tips to enhance practice chapters contain useful how to guides prompts for critical thinking and case studies very little has previously been published on this topic

this first edition of this text was the first book to comprehensively survey the challenges in understanding and working with families whose loved ones are critically ill the comprehensive nature of that book served as a state of the art reference in this sphere for a broad spectrum of researchers and clinicians all chapters were authored by established experts in the respective fields providing an overview that has been used both in theory and practice since the first edition s publication the public recognition of the importance of families has increased dramatically as a consequence of the covid 19 pandemic most major decisions in the intensive care unit icu are shared by clinicians and someone other than the patient improving communication between clinicians and these surrogate decision makers has proven hard in multiple clinical trials families suffer too when their loved ones are critically ill anxiety stress and depression are common and post traumatic stress disorder may occur while their loved ones are still in the icu families struggle to understand prognoses and conflicts with the care team occur frequently these conflicts not only injure families but also contribute to health care provider burnout now in its fully revised and expanded second edition families in the intensive care unit reflects lessons learned during the covid pandemic response as well as knowledge gained about family support when families cannot be at the bedside the chapter subjects again reflect a combination of breadth and depth physical and psychological morbidity are explored as barriers to effective decision making as are cognitive challenges the full array of the interdisciplinary and interprofessional team is represented emphasizing the multimodal approach this edition includes administrative considerations for health care

management and approaches for training members of the health care team similarly family voices are also represented the complete trajectory of needs of care are addressed including survivorship and end of life care

this book highlights real clinical issues which need to be addressed if quality palliative care within icus is to be consistently delivered it is presented in an easily accessible bullet pointed style and is illustrated with case histories from real life patients and drug tables

the origin of modern intensive care units icus has frequently been attributed to the widespread provision of mechanical ventilation within dedicated hospital areas during the 1952 copenhagen polio epidemic however modern icus have developed to treat or monitor patients who have any severe life threatening disease or injury these patients receive specialized care and vital organ assistance such as mechanical ventilation cardiovascular support or hemodialysis icu patients now typically occupy approximately 10 of inpatient acute care beds yet the structure and organization of these icus can be quite different across hospitals in the organization of critical care an evidence based approach to improving quality leaders provide a concise evidence based review of icu organizational factors that have been associated with improved patient or other outcomes the topics covered are grouped according to four broad domains 1 the organization structure and staffing of an icu 2 organizational approaches to improving quality of care in an icu 3 integrating icu care with other healthcare provided within the hospital and across the broader healthcare system and 4 international perspectives on critical care delivery each chapter summarizes a different aspect of icu organization and targets individual clinicians and healthcare decision makers a long overdue contribution to the field the organization of critical care an evidence based approach to improving quality is an indispensable guide for all clinicians and health administrators concerned with achieving state of the art outcomes for intensive care

the global trend of increasingly ageing societies and long term illnesses has meant a growth in demand for intensive care resources this book advises on leadership and organizational development of intensive care units in order to give best practices for governance performance emergency response and safety written by international experts in the field each chapter allows researchers clinicians and service providers worldwide to be able to refer to this single reference book in seven parts the volume will tackle aspects of intensive care management in both global and local contexts and interrogate the key concerns that service providers face it
